OUR CITY SEINAJOKI

Seinäjoki is one of the fastest growing urban centers in Finland, with a population of approximately 65 000 people. Seinäjoki is also the capital of the South Ostrobothnia (Finnish: Etelä- Pohjanmaa) in Western Finland.

Seinäjoki is known nation-wide of its entrepreneurial spirit and "can do" attitude. The city is also renowned for the architecture of Alvar Aalto and many of its popular summer events, such as rock festival Provinssi and tango festival Tangomarkkinat.

Seinäjoki offers high quality education from comprehensive school to university level. Seinäjoki has good transport connections, being situated right at the heart of the Finnish railroad network.

You can reach Seinäjoki by plane and by train.

Helsinki Airport is the main international airport of the Helsinki metropolitan area and of Finland. The airport is located approx. 350 km south from city of Seinäjoki.

Privately owned Seinäjoki Airport 10 km out of city center only serves charter flights.

Seinäjoki Railway Station is located in the centre of the city. It only takes less than 3 hours to get to Seinäjoki from Helsinki by train.

Vaasa Airport is located in the city of Vaasa, approx. 80 km west of Seinäjoki. You can reach Seinäjoki also from Sweden by taking a ferry from Umeå to Vaasa.



OWASP STADION

The home of SJK Seinäjoki is the OmaSp Stadion. Adjacent to SJK's training centre Wallsport Areena, this 2016 built stadium is located only 2 kilometers from Seinäjoki city center.

The OmaSp Stadion was inaugurated on 15th of the June 2016, with the opening game on 18th of June. OmaSp Stadion has the capacity of 5876 spectators. The pitch is the latest technology artificial turf with FIFA QUALITY and QUALITY PRO certificated Saltex Bioflex $^{\text{TM}}$ infill. It has an integrated, undersoil heating system and playing area of 105 x 68 metres.

OmaSp Stadion has two 750-seat restaurants, and it also facilitates fanshop, offices and media working areas. All seats are foldable and VIP-seats are heated. The VIP-area Atria Lounge can be found at the third floor of the stadium.

The stadium is named by our sponsor Oma Säästöpankki (OmaSp), savings bank domiciled in Seinäjoki.



NEW IMPROVEMENTS HETKI STAGE



In the summer 2021 OmaSp Stadium was expanded with stationary stage built in the forecourt of the stadium. Also additional glass-faced terraces were built for the restaurants on floors 2 and 3, to better serve our customers.

The performance stage and event area are sponsored by Hetki product line by our food industry sponsor Fresh Servant.



OUR CLUB

SJK Seinäjoki was formed in 2007 by the merger of two older Seinäjoki clubs, Sepsi-78 and TP-Seinäjoki. The history of football in the city goes all the way back to the year 1930.

SJK Seinäjoki started in the third tier of the Finnish league system (Kakkonen) and was quickly promoted to the second tier (Ykkönen). The end of 2013 saw SJK being promoted by winning the second tier championship. In the 2014 season SJK won the Finnish League cup (Liigacup) and silver medals in their first ever season in the Finnish top tier league (Veikkausliiga).

In their second season in the Veikkausliiga 2015, SJK was crowned as the Champions of Finland. Third season brought even more success, as SJK was crowned the Finnish Cup winners and Veikkausliiga medalists once again with bronze medals.


In 2022 SJK finished third under Seinäjoki-born head coach Jani Honkavaara.

SJK is managed by Spanish coach Joaquín Gómez, who started his job in November 2021, having already background with the club as an assistant manager.

SJK has a full range youth system with over 1000 players and its own academy. Academy team SJK Akatemia plays currently in the second tier of Finland (Ykkönen).

The club plays its home matches at the OmaSp Stadion, which had its inaugural game on 18th of June 2016. The club also has a high-quality indoor training centre Wallsport Arena, which lies right next to the stadium near Seinäjoki city center.

SJK Seinäjoki participated in the UEFA Europa League qualification games during season 2015 – 2016 and on UEFA Champions League qualifications during 2016 – 2017.








